



Škoda Auto is a traditional Czech producer of passenger cars founded in 1895. This makes Škoda Auto one of the oldest automobile brands in the world. It became a subsidiary of the Volkswagen Group in 1991. Management, marketing, product development and most of the manufacturing are still located in Mladá Boleslav.

TPCA

SoP 2005

221,000 units

Toyota and Groupe PSA launched production of city cars in Kolín in early 2005 — four years after the carmakers unveiled their joint-venture project. TPCA was constructed as one of the greenest factories in Europe. Roughly 80% of parts and suppliers are from the Czech Republic. More than 99% of the cars are exported, mainly to Western European markets.



Hyundai

SoP 2008

358,000 units

In 2006, the Korean car manufacturer Hyundai Motor Company decided to build its very first production facility in Europe. This production site is located in Nošovice and it is still the only Hyundai's factory in the European Union. Sixteen subsidiary companies of the Hyundai Motor Group followed this project to invest in the Czech Republic.



Tatra Trucks Est. 1850

1,326 units

Tatra Trucks presented its first car in 1897 making it the third-oldest still existing car manufacturer in the world. Nowadays, Tatra produces heavy-duty off-road vehicles. Its trucks are famous for their ability to pass through the most difficult terrain in extreme climatic conditions and high reliability.



lveco Bus

Est. 1896

Iveco Czech Republic, headquartered in Vysoké Mýto, is the largest production site of Iveco Bus. The original bus factory was established in 1896 as Sodomka, in 1948 it changed its name to Karosa and in 2007 finally adopted the brand Iveco. The company produces both city and intercity bus ranges.



SOR Libchavy

Est. 1991

454 units


SOR Libchavy was established in 1991 and introduced the first bus of its own design two years later. From its beginning the company focused on development and production of low-weight eco-friendly buses.


