



Invitation to the third Czech-Japan Science and Technology Days Tokyo, May 22-24, 2007



The second Czech-Japan Science and Technology Days (CJSTD) took place in Prague on May 15-17, 2006 under the auspices of the Prime Minister of the Czech Republic, Mr. Jiří Paroubek, and the Deputy Prime Minister for Economy, Mr. Jiří Havel. Almost 140 participants attended the event; fifty-three of them were Japanese government officials, business representatives, high-tech specialists and scholars.



Following the above-mentioned successful meeting, all participating organizations from the Czech and Japanese sides agreed to do their best to organize the next meeting in May 2007 in Tokyo.



The third Czech-Japan Science and Technology Days will be held under the auspices of the Prime Minister of the Czech Republic, Mr. Mirek Topolánek, and with the cooperation of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs (MoFA), the Ministry of Economy, Trade and Industry (METI), and the Ministry of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology (MEXT) on the Japanese side. The event is also organized as a follow-up of the official visit of Mr. Václav Klaus, President of the Czech Republic, to Japan in February 2007.


