The US software company Red Hat is expanding the development centre in the Czech Republic. The company is therefore planning to employ an additional 150 engineers to join its current staff of 300 developers and other employees. Red Hat will thus have the world's biggest development facility in the city of Brno. Czech engineers have worked for Red Hat since 2004 on community projects. In June 2006, the American firm established a separate Czech branch. According to the company, the current expansion of the development centre in Brno is proof that, among other things, the Czech Republic has talented people that are worth keeping. The Brno facility is currently involved in the development and testing of all main products and, to a significant extent, the operating system.

• Mitas, a producer of tires for the agriculture industry, is asking for the environmental impact assessment for its intention to build a new production plant in the industrial area Toma Otrokovice and install a similar technology for the tire production in its current production hall Agro. The production capacity in the new plant will likely reach 42,000 tonnes a year. The project will offer also 130 parking

places for cars and 17 parking places for trucks. The intention copes with the creation of 576 new job positions.

• The car manufacturer **Hyundai** in Nosovice hired 180 more employees on Monday August 15 for the intended third shift. There are a total of 3300 employees working at the plant, out of whom 800 have been newly hired. The third shift will probably be launched in the course of this October, after training has ended.

• Czech automaker **Skoda Auto** already employs over 4,000
people in the framework of new
recruitments necessary for the

planned growth in the production
of the model Yeti to 100,000 units
a year, which will likely begin in
September of this year.

• The South Moravia Regional Authority has given an EIA goahead to the plan of CTP Invest to build and operate new buildings within the CTPark Brno – F territory in the Cernovicka terasa industrial zone. The plan comprises four new industrial halls. The total area will be c.

78,530 sq m. There will be premises for some 582 employees. Implementation is scheduled to begin this year. The buildings are set to be launched into operation next year.

The firm Nupharo Park, represented by Zdarek, has applied to the Ústí nad Labem Region Office for environmental impact assessment of its building project in the Nupharo Park facility in Kninice u Libouchce. The company plans a Science Technology Park. Technology Centre and a Business Incubator. The total size is 62,654 sq m, while the built-up area totals 22,110 sq m. Some 850 employees are foreseen.

CTP Invest has requested environmental impact an assessment of its plan to build O23 and building two freestanding structures CTBox I and II in industrial zone CTPark Ostrava-Hrabova II. The O23 building should include seven independent storage, logistics, and distribution facilities; the CTBoxes should be home to administrative, operations and retail units. A total of 642 jobs should be created on site.

• Regional Office of South Moravia has issued an EIA for



CTP Invest's plan to build to new buildings – E2 and E3 – in the Cernovická terasa industrial zone. The new buildings will have a total of 60,310 sq m and offer a capacity of approximately 1,350 jobs. Construction is to begin this year and should be completed in 2013.

R&D

Companies from the Czech Space Alliance association have received eight contracts worth EUR 2.98 mln (CZK 72.4 mln) in a tender announced by the European Space Agency (ESA) focused on research and development projects. contracts will be implemented by ANF Data, CSRC, EGGO Space, Frentech, Iguassu Software Systems, Synpo and Explosia. The Transport Ministry coordinates the space activities and relations with the ESA. The Czechlnvest agency, which also actively supports the industry, has stated that next year, the Republic will conducting key negotiations on the amount of contributions to ESA for the coming four years.

Czech education Minister Josef Dobes has approved results of the first round of the call in the field of the support of university education. Subsidies have been allocated to 55 projects in the total volume of CZK 1.42 bln from the operational programme Vzdelavani konkurenceschopnost to support cooperation among departments, faculties, and universities. It is a call in the framework of so-called Year of Universities, where the Education Ministry of the Czech Republic makes possible for universities to get up to CZK 9 bln.

The rating agency Standard
 Poor's increased the Czech
 Republic's rating by two levels

from A to AA- for long-term liabilities in foreign currencies. According to the Finance Ministry, the agency also increased the country's rating for long-term liabilities in the local currency from A+ to AA. Finance Minister Miroslav Kalousek says the agency recognises the cabinet's efforts to ensure balanced public budgets.

The inflow of foreign direct investments (FDI) to the Czech Republic decreased by 67% y/y in the first quarter of this year. The FDI volume reached CZK 17.4 bln in Q1. According to an analysis of the development of the Czech economy made public by the Ministry of Industry and Trade of the Czech Republic (MPO), the highest amount of capital headed to the Czech Republic in the form of reinvested profits, whose volume totalled CZK 25.2 bln. The majority of FDI were realised by Dutch investors, who secured the inflow of capital in the amount of CZK 14 bln in the first quarter of this year.
